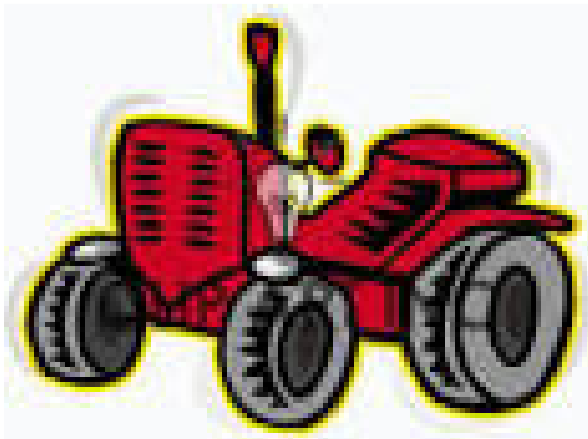
WRITE TO THANK A FARMER

The food you eat, the clothes you wear, the house you live in, everything you use in your day-to-day life comes from a farmer. Not just the milk on your cereal, or the eggs you have for breakfast, without farmers there would be no sheets for your bed, socks for your feet or paper to write on at school.

For your entry to thank a farmer, **choose a product and discover how a farmer helped produce it**, or **think about the jobs a farmer did to help make it**.

Write and edit **your own poem, letter or story thanking a farmer** for producing the products for our food, and the things we need to live. You may write any style of a poem, letter or a short fiction or non-fiction piece.

Decorate your piece with images that support what you have written, and make sure that your **text is large enough to read**. Your entry must be suitable for children 6-12 years old.



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Poem

Entry must be suitable for children aged 6-12 years old.

The poem must fit within a single A3 page mounted on cardboard. The font must be large enough to read from 2m away.

Poem and decoration must be entrant's own work. It must be hand written and decorations hand drawn. Any style of poem is acceptable.

Judging guidelines (poem)

- Poem is neatly structured and well organized.
- Poem shows obvious characteristics of a poem such as rhythm, rhyme.
- All the information presented is related to the topic of farming and resource production. Illustrations support the text.
- Grammar and punctuation are correct, with limited spelling errors.
- Text encourages an interest in the audience, both with writing and visually.
- Appropriate use of color, font, pictures and layout.
- Poem and decorations show imagination and creativity.
- Name and contact details are clearly on the back of entry.

Letter

Entry must be suitable for children aged 6-12 years old.

The letter must fit within a single A3 page mounted on cardboard. The font must be large enough to read from 2m away.

Letter and decoration must be entrant's own work. It must be hand written and decorations hand drawn.

Judging guidelines (letter)

- Letter is neatly structured and well organized.
- All the information presented is related to the topic of farming and resource production. Illustrations support the text.
- Letter contains necessary components including date, address, signature.
- Grammar and punctuation are correct, with limited spelling errors.
- Text encourages an interest in the audience, both with writing and visually.
- Appropriate use of color, font, pictures and layout.
- Letter and decorations show imagination and creativity.
- Name and contact details are clearly on the back of entry.

Fiction or Non-Fiction Prose

Entry must be suitable for children aged 6-12 years old.

The prose must fit within two A3 pages mounted on cardboard, with a maximum of 500 words. The font must be large enough to read from 2m away.

Prose and decoration must be entrant's own work. It must be hand written and decorations hand drawn.

Judging guidelines (prose)

- Prose is neatly structured and well organized with an introduction, body and conclusion.
- All the information presented is related to the topic of farming and resource production. Illustrations support the text.
- Grammar and punctuation are correct, with limited spelling errors.
- Prose shows good use of description, literary techniques and narrative (for fiction) or factual recount (for non-fiction).
- Text encourages an interest in the audience, both with writing and visually.
- Appropriate use of color, font, pictures and layout.
- Prose and decorations show imagination and creativity.
- Name and contact details are clearly on the back of entry.
