

Class 18 – Primary School Age Project Report

REPORT ON A PROJECT YOU ARE INVOLVED IN THAT SHOWS HOW IMPORTANT OUR FOOD SOURCES ARE.

Most of **our food has to be produced for us**. Plants are grown, and animals are raised to produce the food we eat everyday. Our farmers produce everything that goes into what we eat, what we wear and how we live. And understanding where it all comes from and the processes that go into making the end product is very important.



Use a **project** that you have underway at school or home that shows where your food comes from, and **write a report outlining the project** and the **importance of the product**.



This project report should be presented as an **A2 sized poster**, suitable for children aged 6-12 years old, and focus around a food production process. Examples of this may be:

- A **veggie garden** (either at school or home), showing the set-up, the processes involved in growing the plants and the possible uses of the plants produced.
- A **chicken coop** (either at school or home), showing the processes involved in raising a chicken, the lifecycle of a chicken and the possible products that can be produced.
- Research into all of the **products that go into** the making of a **balanced meal**, creating a process story for each component.
- Research into the **foods** that are produced during **different seasons** throughout the year: winter vegetables, summer crops etc.

The font of writing and images must be large enough to read from 2m away. Poster and decoration must be entrant's own work.

Judging guidelines

- The project selected for the project report is directly related to farming and resource production.
- All the information presented is factual and related to the project.
- A bibliography for any research is included on the back of the poster.
- The poster is neatly organized and well presented.
- Images and illustrations are included to support the information on the poster.
- The project and research show originality and creativity.
- Name and contact details are clearly on the back of entry.
